#### **Code Of Conduct**

Our code of conduct is based on firm expectations and is designed to ensure that everone is treated respectfully by creating a safe, caring and orderly learning environment. This code is taught, reviewed and reinforced continuously. Students are expected to accept responsibility for their actions and behaviour.

Upholding the expectations within the Code of Conduct is the responsibility of every staff member. The role of the principal is to support staff authority. At Drinkwater we work together as a team to make a difference for all our students.

## **Expectations for Student Conduct**

The school is a community where people learn and grow together. At Drinkwater School we work together to encourage behaviours that foster positive peer relationships in the classroom and on the playground. Every student has the right to learn in a safe, secure environment.

Our code of conduct can be simplified into three main categories These are:

- Be Respectful
- Be Responsible
- Be Safe

The Drinkwater Code of Conduct is to be followed while on the school premises, going to and returning from school, and in the community.

## **Conduct Expectations:**

Student conduct must meet the standards expected for students in School District #79 District Code of Conduct and for Drinkwater School. In order to help create a safe, caring and orderly school environment that fosters respect, inclusion, fairness and equity, the board requires students to:

- 1. Respect the learning environment of others.
- 2. Be aware of and obey all school behaviour expectations.
- 3. Attend school regularly and punctually.

- 4. Respect the rights and property of all persons within the school including peers, staff and parents.
- 5. Respect the diversity of the school community.
- 6. Not discriminate through publication, service, accommodation or facility in the school environment.
- 7. Behave in a safe and responsible manner at all times; and
- 8. Not threaten, harass, intimidate, assault, or be aggressive, or retaliate against a person who has reported an incident; and
- 9. Not be in possession of , use, or distribute weapons or illegal or restricted substances.

### Consequences

The severity and frequency of unacceptable conduct as well as the age, maturity and special needs of students is considered in determining appropriate disciplinary action. Responses to unacceptable conduct will be consistent and fair and be restorative, rather than punitive, wherever possible and appropriate.

Drinkwater Elementary School will treat seriously behavior or communication that discriminates based on race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, sex or sexual orientation (*prohibited grounds set out in the BC Human Rights Code*).

### **Rising Expectations:**

As students grow older and more mature, it is our expectation that they be held to a progressively higher standard of personal responsibility and self-discipline and will face increasing consequences for inappropriate behaviour.

Should the Code of Conduct not be followed, one or more of the following strategies may be applied:

- > Time-out
- Walking with a supervisor
- > Phone call to parents or guardians
- > Referral to school counselor
- Replacement or repair of damaged property
- Writing about the incident in a Problem Solving Report
- Referral to principal or teacher-in-charge
- > Temporary loss of lunch or play time privileges
- ➤ Loss of privileges ex. school sponsored extra-curricular activities
- Restricted school hours
- In-school suspension or Out-of-school suspension
- > Actions directed by S.D. policy and regulations

Actions directed by the criminal code

At Drinkwater Elementary, the following behaviours will not be tolerated:

- physical or verbal abuse
- intimidation, harassment or aggression
- possession of weapons, drugs, alcohol, tobacco

The principal has the right to modify the discipline cycle.

#### **Notification:**

In the event of serious breaches of conduct, school officials may advise other parties of those breaches including:

- parents of student offender(s)
- parents of student victim(s)
- > school district officials as required by school district policy
- police and/or other agencies as required by law
- ➤ Parent community when deemed to be important to reassure members of the school community that school officials are aware of a serious situation or incident and are taking appropriate action to address it.

#### **Retaliation Prevention:**

The school and the Board will take all reasonable steps to prevent retaliation against a student who has made a complaint of a breach of a code of conduct.

Note: If behaviour is a major offence – child is sent to office

# Drinkwater Elementary School's CODE OF CONDUCT BE RESPECTFUL – BE RESPONSIBLE- BE SAFE

## You have the <u>right</u> to learn in a safe, caring, orderly and positive school climate.

Your RESPONSIBILITY is to attend school regularly and be on time, to be organized, to do your best work and to work in ways that do not disturb others

#### You have the <u>right</u> to learn in an environment that respects all people.

Your RESPONSIBILITY is to be courteous and polite, to respect the feelings and opinions of others, to treat others as you would want to be treated, appreciate and accept the differences in others, to be a good listener, to encourage others in a positive way and to include other people in activities

#### You have the right to feel and be safe.

Your RESPONSIBILITY is to follow school and safety rules, to help others to be safe, to solve problems in a peaceful ways, to be aware of emergency drills, and to follow directions of school staff.

#### You have the right to privacy and to your own personal space.

Your RESPONSIBILITY is to respect the personal property of others, and to accept their right to privacy.

#### You have the right to a comfortable and clean environment.

Your RESPONSIBILITY is to clean up after yourself, to reduce, reuse, recycle, and to treat Drinkwater School and grounds with care.
